Holden is once again joining forces with the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation (ARRO) this week for the annual road rescue training event, the 'Capital Rescue Challenge 2014'. To be held from 24 to 27 July 2014 at Lardner Park, near Warragul, Victoria, this event will once again assist in honing the emergency response skills of road rescue workers from across Australia, New Zealand, Singapore and Hong Kong.

This is the 16th year that Holden has partnered with ARRO in the Challenge and is once again donating 70 Holden vehicles to be used in simulating roadside crash events.
